ELIGIBILITY

Measurement Certificates and Homologation papers complying with the rules MUST BE PROVIDED in accordance with UIM 501 & 505.13.

The Officer of the Day has the absolute discretion to withdraw any driver who he feels is not able to perform to an acceptable standard.

The minimum age for entrants is 16 years.

LIABILITIES

While every precaution will be taken to ensure safety of people, property and craft, the Organiser does not accept responsibility for any accident or loss of persons, property or craft arising from this meeting. Should a driver have a claim made against his insurance THEY MAY BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE £1000 STERLING EXCESS, which is part of the National Authority's Third Party Liability policy. All international competitors must purchase insurance from Race Control for £50 Sterling.

BOAT NUMBERS;-

State your race number on the entry form. International numbers will be given preference in accordance with UIM 206.02. It is the driver's responsibility to correctly display the allocated number for Scrutineering.

SCRUTINEERING:- Will take place in the pits compound. You must present your boat, equipment and papers to the official Scrutineer before Signing on. Scales will be available for pre-race weighing, the scales shall not be protested and drivers must bring their own slings.

The following are mandatory: -

Helmet to UIM 205.07

Life Jacket non-inflatable to UIM 205.06

Protective clothing to UIM 205.11

Towing rope in accordance with local rules.

FUEL: -

Competitors will only be allowed to race with fuel purchased from the Shell filling station approximately 500m from the pits. Fuel samples will be taken and tested in accordance with UIM 508.08.

SIGNING ON: -

After passing the Scrutineer and before launching drivers must sign on at Race Control in the Clubhouse.

PITS; -

Pit Marshal's directions are mandatory. The pits will be closed from 8.00pm. on Saturday.

DRIVER'S BRIEFING: - Will be in the Clubhouse as per the published programme. THE PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO ATTEND IS DISQUALIFICATION

PROTESTS:-

The protest fee is £50 Sterling.

RESCUE BOATS:-


Rescue boats have the right of way at all times for all purposes

LAUNCHING:-

Launching will be under the strict control of the Pits Marshal and his instructions will be obeyed at all times.

COURSE: -

1069m, two buoy course straight up and down Oulton Broad turning to port. Drivers going outside the course markers will be disqualified.



TIMED LAPS: -

Pontoon positions will be given from timed practice, all practice sessions will be timed.

STARTS: -

From a pontoon, the signal to start the race will be by lights. It is drivers responsibility to be in his allotted position on the pontoon.

DURATION: -

Final 4 heats. Three to count.

Each heat will be of six laps duration plus a safety lap.

MARK OF THE COURSES: -

Destroying a turn buoy penalty £85.

RE-STARTS: - In the event of a stopped race, if the leading boat has covered less than 5 laps, there will be one restart over the full distance with refuelling allowed, in accordance with UIM rule 311.02

WATER APPROVAL: - In the event of there being more than 16 entries qualifying for the final will be in accordance with UIM rule 304.03.

FINISH: -

A black and white chequered flag will be shown as soon as first boat completes the race. As soon as the flag has been received reduce speed, carry on round the course and return to the pits. To be classed as a finisher a boat shall take the chequered flag having completed at least 75% of the race winner's laps.

RESULTS: -

Will be posted in the pits and deemed confirmed half an hour after posting subject only to any valid Protest, Disciplinary Hearing and Appeal.

COURSE CLOSED:-

When red flag is flown by the OOD

SAFETY AND CONDUCT GENERALLY:-

It is the drivers responsibility to drive in accordance with the prevailing conditions. Sanctions will be taken against anyone on or off the water whose actions or lack of action cause or exacerbates an incident. Should there be a serious incident please note that however closely you are involved the only statements made shall be by the OOD. The adequacy and proper use of all structures, fixtures and fittings are the drivers responsibility please ensure all equipment is secure and all straps, wires, ropes etc. are properly anchored and tensioned. All hydroplanes must be equipped with a prop guard, which will be checked at scrutineering and on the start pontoon. Any boat not so equipped will not be allowed to start.
